Internationalization of the City

from the perspective of junior high school students In the meeting, 9 groups of students gave the presentations about their images of "a Cosmopolitan City." The main points of their presentations are as follows:

Promoting the understanding

Advanced Infrastructure in the City

Increase the opportunities properly to learn the major languages including English, German, Spanish, and French languages,

By increasing those opportunities, it would be more comfortable for foreign visitors to stay in UK and it also would be easier to understand foreign languages and cultures when UK citizens visit different countries.





Increase the opportunities to communicate with foreign residents, through sports activities recreational events.

Forming a society where ethnic groups enjoy their daily life.

By improving these elements we will increase the number of people who understand the importance of cultural diversity in the world.
